Workshop Descriptions

BUSINESS MANAGEMENT:

In the past, your crew has been taking courses like Water Quality, Insects and Diseases, Invasive Species and Forest Management. We know it's important to keep trained professionals in the woods where they belong, but in today's economic climate, it's been very challenging to do so. The following courses focus on how you can ensure the stability and prosperity of your operation so that Qualified Logging Professionals can stay in the woods where they belong while applying the education they've accumulated over the years. These courses attempt to directly target SFI Objectives 9, 11, 12, 14, and 15.

ADVANCED QUICKBOOKS: Kayla Duncan of MBE CPA's will show you how to use QuickBooks to best meet the needs for your business. You will learn how to create reports and graphs and use forms and other QuickBooks accounts.

SUCCESSIONING YOUR BUSINESS: Mike Boyd helps you keep trained professionals in the woods even when you're ready to pass the business down to the next generation. Learn how to succession your business and maintain or improve the health of your company.

TIMBER ECONOMICS: Terry Marc of Agstar shares with us the current state of the US and global economies, how they influence the forest products economy and techniques to position your business for success.

FORESTRY AND ECOLOGY:

The following courses focus on impacts affecting the resources that support the forest products industry. As Qualified Logging Professionals, our responsibility is to sustainably utilize our resources for the long-term support of the industry that, in turn, supports our operations and communities. Elements of all fifteen SFI objectives are touched on in the following courses.

BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES FOR INVASIVE SPECIES: (8 hour core curriculum) Non-native, invasive species pose a profound threat to forest ecosystems and productivity. This workshop enables participants to identify the most troublesome plant and insect species, better understand the impact they can make and slow the spread of invaders. Speakers are from the WI DNR.

BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES FOR WATER QUALITY: (8 hours of core curriculum) Covers planning, timber harvesting, forest road design and location, wetland and stream crossings, riparian management zones, and the permitting process of crossings. Part of this session will be held outdoors. Speakers are from the WI DNR.

PESTICIDE APPLICATOR TRAINING AND EXAM: Interested in obtaining your pesticide applicators license? Attend this review session with DATCP and PAT for SFI continuing education credit and stay for the certification exam. ***NOTE – If you are staying for the certification exam, you MUST purchase the study manual through DATCP for an additional \$47. Call FISTA for more information.**

SILVICULTURE AND TIMBER SALE MARKING: Common silvicultural systems used in Wisconsin and how those systems relate to tree marking strategies used by foresters. Topics include common regeneration systems, intermediate treatments, and order of removal. Speakers are Brad Hutnik and Greg Edge of the WI DNR. **This class may also include a field session. Dress accordingly.**

WILDLIFE & FOREST MANAGEMENT: Ron Eckstein will provide discussion about how wildlife management and forest management can be implemented simultaneously. Topics will include managing for specific wildlife species, wildlife openings, leave trees, and much more

GYPSY MOTH AWARENESS: DATCP will give you the tools that you would need to comply with federal pest quarantines. This class will piggyback some of the classes on the schedule.

LOGGING SAFETY, TECHNOLOGY, RESOURCE PROTECTION AND UTILIZATION:

These courses expose the Logging and Forestry professional to safety standards regarding logging equipment, trucking, chainsaw operation and record keeping. SFI Objectives 9, 10, 11, 13 and 15 are targeted in these courses.

DOT COMPLIANCE: Tom Senecal of GT Associates provides instruction on load securement, hours of service, drug and alcohol testing, driver qualification files, and time sheet and log book requirements.

MANAGING YOUR UPTIME WITH TECHNOLOGY: Nortrax will present a wide array of information in Merrill, WI on April 13th

HYDRAULIC SAFETY & MAINTAINING A SAFE MACHINE: They will be covering Hydraulic Safety, Bar & Chain Maintenance and 4 Roller Heads.

HYDRAULIC HOSE, FITTING SAFETY & MAINTENANCE CLINIC: Clinic covers how to safely make & maintain hydraulic hoses and fittings to reduce the chances of injury. Items discussed include, thread identification, proper hose application, hose cutting & assembly, hose cleaning, guarding options and items to make the process safer and easier.

HARVESTER BAR & CHAIN SAFETY & MAINTENANCE CLINIC: Clinic covers how to safely maintain your cutting systems bar, chain and sprocket to reduce chances of injury and extend the life of cutting system. Items discussed include how to repair chains, sharpening chains with hand held grinders and automatic grinders and bar maintenance including bar straightening with power straightener.

911 FOR WOODSMEN: “KEEP CALM, THINK CLEARLY: HeartQuest instructors provide initial 1st Aid & certification and re-certification classes; an OSHA requirement for loggers.

SAFE HYDRAULICS: Improve safety, reduce downtime and increase production through proper installation and preventative maintenance procedures. The Safe Hydraulics course will cover the following topics: hydraulic hose safety, periodic inspections, troubleshooting, hose and coupling selection, proper hose assembly and installation. This course is ideal for anyone in the timber profession as hydraulics form an integral part of all forestry careers.

HYDRAULIC & LUBRICATING OILS: Learn more about proper hydraulic and lubricating oils for the newer, high performance equipment. Speakers are from Halron Lubricants.

CHAINSAW SAFETY: Various levels of techniques to make you a safer and more productive chain saw operator.

LOGGER APPRECIATION DAY: Louisiana Pacific will be giving mill tours and a thorough review of their wood specs. In particular, they will discuss why they can't use pulpwood sticks that are too small, large, crooked or rotten. Examples of how non-spec wood negatively affects their manufacturing process will also be covered. Lunch will be provided for all that attend.

WELDING SAFETY OF LOGGERS: Nicolet College will identify common causes of accidents, recognize safety hazards in the shop or other work environments, select and properly use safety equipment appropriate to working conditions, recognize and evaluate potential safety hazards and react to prevent accidents and special ferrous welding applications will be covered as it relates to the following metals (T1, AR400, and cast iron).

USER'S BEWARE: Rich Good of FISTA will be covering things you may have forgotten. Topics will range from PPE to truck safety.

BASIC HYDRAULIC'S & RISLEY/DASA COMPUTER TRAINING: Bert Jonsson will present basic hydraulics training on harvesters and forwarders and Tim Gafner from Risley will talk about Risley/Dasa computer training.

DEF TRAINING: Nortrax will present information on the DEF systems and how to maintain it in Ashland, WI on April 22nd.

MAXIMIZING HARDWOOD GRADE: Topics include proper bucking, principles of log scaling and grading, identifying defects and specialty products. Jim Dougovito teaches us how to cut for grade and increase profits. **This class may also include a field session. Dress accordingly.**

LOG TRUCK SAFETY: Topics include responsibilities and duties to be in compliance with FMCSA, Best practices for proper maintenance of trucks as required by the DOT and awareness of the insurance industry, trends and how to ensure long term affordable insurance.
